Collective Worship with Revd. Tom Studman



To explore our value of **Curiosity**, Revd Tom told the story of Moses and the burning bush to illustrate how keeping an open mind and treading gently can lead us to spirituality and God.



In collective worship, Revd Tom spoke to the children about the **importance of reflection** during the **period of Lent leading up to Easter**. We looked at the story of Jesus in the desert and how we can resist temptation and say no to influences around us.



Resilience - When explaining the story of Jonah and the Whale, Revd Tom read out the story from the Bible and also the same story of Prophet Yunus in the Quran.

To understand the value of **Responsibility**, Revd. Tom spoke to the children about being God's Stewards on Earth and being responsible about looking after all of God's creation. All our choices are important.





During collective worship, Mr Hunter asked the Ethos Team children to explain how Culture Day is linked to our **school value 'Unity'**.

The Reception children enjoyed Revd. Tom's visit to their class.

Revd. Tom spoke about his role as a Vicar of St Margaret's Church and how he helps other people.

He explained how this was similar to the important people in the children's own faiths



During collective worship, Revd. Tom shared the Proverbs (6.6-8) on **Responsibility and working hard**.

We reflected about working hard in school and at home and asked God to help us be inspired by the ants... 'Consider it's ways and be wise'
