Year 3 celebrated their attendance award by spending their winnings on a bouncy castle. Everyone had great fun!




5KS enjoyed an exciting trip to the Velodrome this week, where they experienced the thrill of BMX cycling!

## Fantastic Results to Celebrate!

*We are proud to share that our pupils have achieved above national averages in every stage of their learning this year:*

- **KS2 (Year 6):** 67% met the expected standard in reading, writing & maths combined (national avg: 62%), with strong results across all subjects — including 85% in maths and 80% in writing.
- **Year 4 Times Tables:** Average score 21.5/25 (national avg: 20.6), with 47% scoring full marks!
  - **Year 1 Phonics:** 86% met the expected standard (national avg: 80%).
  - **Early Years:** 70% achieved a Good Level of Development (national avg: 67%).

- Head to your local library to sign up for free and receive your collector card
- If you're 0-16, you can take part!
- Borrow and read library books during the summer
- Any library book counts - you can read stories or fact books, poetry or graphic novels
- Let library staff know when you've read six books and you'll be awarded a winner's medal.

But wait, there's more! When you complete the challenge, you'll be entered into a prize draw to win a £100 toyshop voucher and a bundle of books! Plus, there are lots of extra prizes to win all through the summer! We will even send your certificate to your school so your teachers can see how brilliant you are!

\* Applies to children aged 5-11 who go to a Manchester local authority primary school.

**Grown-ups! Why is reading for pleasure important?**

The 'summer slide' is where children lose some of the skills and knowledge they learned during the school year because they don't practise them over the summer. This can make it harder for them to catch up when school starts again. Reading during the summer helps prevent this by keeping their brains active and improving their reading skills.

The Summer Reading Challenge can help with all this!
