Well done to the **boys' football team** who competed at the FIVES tournament, winning three matches and drawing one.

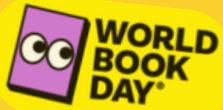


Reception to Year 6 geared up for World Book Day with exciting workshops from 'As Creatives', inspired by the character Fillolog!
