St Margaret's C of E Primary School received an allocation of £46,240.

Recruitment of an additional experienced teacher for two terms to lead small group targeted interventions	£28,000	Analysis of data indicated pupils in year 2 and year 3 had been most impacted by the lockdown periods. Pupils who had fallen behind in relation to their prior attainment were targeted for small group and 1:3 to intervention based up gaps in their learning. These pupils made accelerated progress catching up on their lost learning.	Continue to track outcomes for these pupils to ensure they consolidate the learning they have caught up with and remain on-track for age related expectations.
Diagnostic Assessments	£1,000	Diagnostic assessments were purchased to target gaps in SEND pupils impacted by the pandemic. The use of the diagnostic assessments allowed catch up support for these pupils to be tailored to their needs.	Assessment use ongoing throughout the coming year to inform planning and to identify and tackle any gaps the pupils may have in their learning.
Phonics – RWI development days, tutoring, speed sounds, RWI resources	£3000	86% of pupils passed the phonics screen check in year 2 in 2020.	Targeted interventions to support those pupils who did not pass the PSC. Continued use of resources to support pupils.
Purchase of additional laptops.	£5000	The additional expenditure on the purchase of laptops ensured pupils were able to access remote learning during the lock down period. The investment in the laptops enabled pupils to access remote learning and continue to progress with their learning.	The additional laptops will be targeted to support disadvantaged pupils to complete homework set remotely.
EYFS PSED resources	£2000	Pupil needs were correctly identified. Appropriate support was in place to allow pupils to make progress.	Continue using WELLCOMM screening tool to identify early gaps in language development
Recruitment of an independent Speech and Language therapist.	£7,240	A large number of pupils are supported by the Speech and language therapist bought in by the school, this additional expenditure ensured staff received training to deliver interventions supporting identified pupils to make progress towards their therapy targets.	SaLT will continue to be invested in by the school moving forward throughout the course of the academic year. This will continue to target those pupils who have been affected disproportionately by the lockdowns.
